## Databases

# Librarians



## Subject Liaison Librarians

Subject Liaison Librarians work to support teaching, learning, and research in every school and discipline at IUPUI. If you would like to improve the quality and credibility of sources used in student work and introduce your students to discipline-specific resources, invite your Subject Liaison Librarian to lead information literacy sessions for classes of any size, in-person or online.



## Information Literacy Instruction

A Subject Liaison Librarian could come into your class to teach students about:

- Thesis/Topic Development
- Research Strategies
- Finding & Evaluating Sources
- Citation Processes & Norms, including plagiarism and more

Learning outcomes for sessions are tied to information literacy concepts (the set of skills needed to find, retrieve, analyze, and use information effectively), the PLUS+ and the Principles of Graduate and Professional Learning.

## Subject and Course Guides

To make library resources more navigable, subject liaison librarians create and maintain subject guides with a list of resources tailored to specific disciplines. These guides describe ways of finding information, provide detailed information about databases, and contain learning objects like how-to videos and infographics. Subject guides are available on the Library's website and integrated into Canvas through the Library Research Guide tab in course sites. Librarians can also provide additional course support including developing course-specific guides and integrating information literacy tutorials and quizzes into Canvas.

## Consultations

Course instructors can make textbooks and other course materials available freely so that students have the opportunity to use them without purchasing personal copies. When an instructor completes a course reserves request, the Library is able to lend hard-copy course materials to students for short-term checkout from the Service & Information Desk. # Open Access



IUPUI University Library boosts the impact of scholarly works authored by IUPUI faculty and graduate students by providing open access (OA) dissemination. Recent studies on citation impact have found: scholarly OA articles are cited 18% more than articles published behind a paywall (Piwowar, et al., 2018). The Library helps IUPUI authors find readers and get cited by supporting a range of low-labor, no-cost OA services. Key features of these services include: IUPUI ScholarWorks, the OA fund, and Open Journals at IUPUI.



Scholarly publications are expensive. Buying access to an article in a scholarly journal can cost \$30 or more. The good news is that while you're at IUPUI, you have access to subscription journals in our databases and through interlibrary loan. The even better news is that IUPUI is working to increase free, open access to scholarly literature for everyone.
